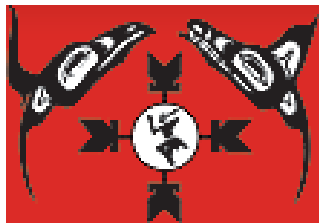

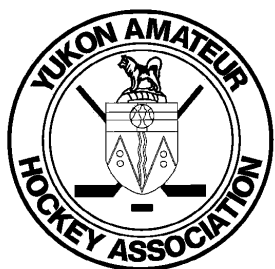

**Equipment Tip # 11 –
THROAT PROTECTORS**

PROTECTIVE QUALITY

There are two types of throat protectors: bib style or collar style. The bib style provides more protection to the chest area. Each are generally made of ballistic nylon or similar material.

Throat protectors are designed to protect the throat area from lacerations and cuts. They are NOT designed to protect against spinal injuries to the neck region. All throat protectors must bear the Bureau de normalisation du Québec (BNQ) logo. If the neck guard is altered the BNQ Certification is void.



FITTING

The throat protector should be snug but not uncomfortably tight.

Bib style protectors are worn beneath the shoulder pads and offer increased protection.

The throat protector should completely cover the throat and with bib styles, the upper chest area.

MAINTENANCE

Dry after each session in a well ventilated area.

The throat protector should be washed regularly in cold water and hung to dry, away from direct heat sources.



HELPFUL HINTS

Keep all Velcro fasteners in good shape and replace if necessary.
